

Jack Pemberton Youth Development Bursary

The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, in partnership with 4-H Canada, is pleased to offer the Jack Pemberton Youth Development Bursary to a senior 4-H member in Canada with a keen interest in agriculture and a desire to attend Toronto's Royal Agricultural Winter Fair.

Jack Pemberton was a Past President and Honourary Life Governor of The RAWF. Mr. Pemberton created this opportunity to travel to Toronto to visit The Royal firsthand, as he felt it is a wonderful experience for anyone who is interested in agriculture.

The 102nd RAWF runs from November 1 to 10, 2024. The successful applicant will be awarded a \$3,000 bursary.

- \$2,250 of the funds will be used to cover the cost of travel to and within Toronto (airfare and all transportation between the airport, hotel, and The Royal grounds).
- \$750 of the funds will go towards the recipient's post-secondary education.

In memory of Mr. Pemberton, The Royal will provide general admission passes and up to three nights of accommodation (double occupancy) for the winner and a guest. A suggested itinerary of events to attend, including some VIP opportunities, will also be provided by The Royal staff, based on the interests expressed in the recipient's application.



Campbellbrook Fund 4-H Canada Trade Scholarship

In partnership with the Campbellbrook Fund, 4-H Canada is proud to offer five (5) scholarships valued at \$1,000 each. The scholarship aims to support senior 4-H youth from coast-to-coast who intend to pursue a post-secondary education in a trade-based program or apprenticeship, and who plan to apply their education in a career that supports the agriculture sector.

FCC 4-H Club Fund

4-H Canada and Farm Credit Canada (FCC) are pleased to provide the FCC 4-H Club Fund on an annual basis to support shared priorities, growth, and increased engagement of the 4-H movement in Canada. These funds are available to all 4-H clubs, districts, and regions across Canada.

The support from the Club Fund can go towards volunteer capacity building, promotion, advertising of the 4-H movement, eliminating barriers to entry, developing existing programs, covering the costs associated with local events, supporting volunteers, or purchasing various resource materials. Together with FCC, we are supporting the development of responsible, caring, and contributing youth leaders across Canada. \$100,000 is available in grants of up to \$500 per club, district, or region across Canada. Funding requests are encouraged but not limited to focusing on one of the following strategic priorities: growth, inclusion, or volunteer capacity building.

Volunteer Leader of the Year

The Volunteer Leader of the Year Award recognizes the volunteer leaders who are the biggest champions of the 4-H program! With their support and guidance, 4-H members receive outstanding experiences and skills that help them continue to be responsible, caring, and contributing youth who are positively impacting the world around them. The winning national volunteer receives a prize package including a \$1,000 cash prize and registration for the 2024 Leadership Summit. In addition to the winning national volunteer, one leader from each province is selected as the Provincial Volunteer Leader of the Year and receives a \$100 cash prize.

Selection of the provincial winners and the National Volunteer Leader of the Year is based on a letter describing the 4-H leader's service to 4-H and the impact they have had, including club involvement, 4-H involvement, community involvement, length of involvement, leadership, and how much the members have learned and developed as a result of the leader.

Honourary Membership

Proudly sponsored by Farm Credit Canada, 4-H Canada's Honourary Membership recognizes individuals who have embodied 4-H values through their life and have delivered outstanding services to one or more levels of the organization.

This recognition was created in 1950 to acknowledge individuals who have made outstanding contributions to 4-H in Canada. Honourary Members are nominated by members of 4-H Canada and approved by the Board of Directors.

Distinguished Alumni Award

The Distinguished Alumni Award recognizes the outstanding leadership and contributions of 4-H alumnus to our communities, country, and world.

Selection Criteria

The award recipient will be selected by a panel of reviewers based on these criteria:

- Demonstrated leadership and contributions to their field and the world.
- Being an outstanding role model of 4-H values (critical thinking, service, loyalty, and healthy living) and support for future generations.
- Experience as a 4-H youth member. The nominee does not currently need to be involved with 4-H.

Loran Scholars

Who: Canadian students who are at least 16 years of age by September 1st of the following year. Those who are in their final year of uninterrupted full-time studies in high school and/or CEGEP demonstrating outstanding academic achievement, extracurricular activity and leadership potential.

Value: Several scholarships of \$100,000 over four years, including mentorship, funding for summer internships and participation in an extensive network of past and present scholars.

Up to 52 Finalist awards of \$5000 are awarded to finalists who attend national selections but are not selected as Loran Scholars. Up to 50 Provincial awards of \$2,000 are awarded to students who are short-listed but do not make the final scholars list.

Volunteers play a crucial role in the success of all 4-H programs and events, supporting and guiding youth in acquiring essential life skills and personal growth.


There are 3 levels of volunteering with a 4-H Club

- Commit to Kids Online Training or Equivalent
- Signed Code of Conduct (included in the online registration)

All 4-H activities, whether they be in person or virtually, are required to comply with the Rule of Two.
