Getting Ready for AGM!

AGM is coming up November 23rd and sets Quebec 4-H up for the year ahead. Did you know that Quebec 4-H is the only province who's Board of Directors is made up of youth members?

Board Directors

Provincial Directors are elected by their clubs to work together to represent Quebec 4-H's interests, attend all board meetings, and help out local clubs in their area when needed. Clubs can elect up to 2 directors annually and are encouraged to be 18 years old or older. The Quebec 4-H Executive

The executive committee is made up of the President, Vice-President, Past-President, Chair of the Finance Committee, and the Chair of the Programs and Regulations Committee.

The President and Vice-President are elected at AGM. The committees are appointed at AGM and they select their committee chairs the same day.

Finance Committee

This committee is made up of 3 to 10 members who help manage Quebec 4-H's finances, including budgeting, salaries, and expenses, while gaining valuable financial skills and experience.

Programs and Regulations Committee

Made up of 5 to 15 members, the committee helps shape Quebec 4-H programs and rules, reviews policies, and guide events like the AGM, Leadership Conference, and Junior Camps. Be part of important decisions, including delegate selection for National 4-H programs!

Advisory Committee

Do you know someone with great insight who can help guide Quebec 4-H's provincial board? Nominate them for the Advisory Committee, where they'll help review policies, bylaws, and offer advice on important decisions to the Provincial Board!

How to Record Your Video for Show Your 4-H Colours

This year for Show Your 4-H Colours we're asking YOU to share how 4-H has shaped who you are today. Please record a 30 second to 1 minute video answering any of the following discussion points:



- 1. Describe how 4-H has shaped who you are today.
- 2. Describe how the skills you've developed through 4-H help you in your current career.
- 3. What has been your biggest takeaway while working with/being a part of 4-H?
- 4. What's one of your favourite memories as a 4-H member, leader, staffer, board member, or trustee?
- 5. What advice would you give to the next generation of 4-H youth members?
- 6. In your own words, what is the value of 4-H?



Mic Check

Testing testing 1-2-3... is this thing on? Make sure before you record your video that you test your microphone quality! Try to find a quiet space with minimal background noise (it's easier to get quality audio indoors; if outside, try find a spot with minimal wind), and make sure that nothing is covering your mic (including your own hand!). Connecting a separate microphone? A quick practice recording is key to preventing the need to re-record.





We want to show the faces of real members of the 4-H community! In order to do that, we need to make sure we can see you. The best filming conditions are facing towards natural light (i.e. a window). If that's not possible, make sure to avoid any backlighting and turn on any lights in front of you.



Camera

Please be sure to film yourself vertically, and NOT horizontally. This will maximize our use of the videos across all channels (Reels and TikTok especially). Make sure you are center frame with a generous border of space around you, we can always zoom-in when editing!
